In 1874, Mary Phillips created the Home for Aged Women, a sanctuary for woman in need of housing and assistance with care. In 1903, Lysander Strickland helped organize the same for men when the Home for Aged Men came into existence.

In 1975, the Boards of Managers of the two homes concluded that consolidation would strengthen and improve both programs.

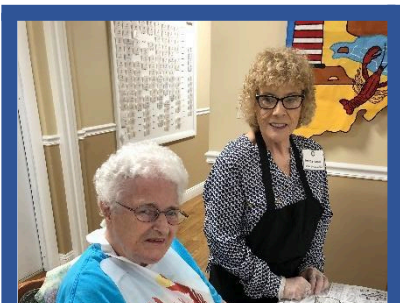
Thus, Phillips-Strickland House was born.

In 2000, Boyd Place was built and has 33 apartments for independent seniors not needing direct care.

## IT TAKES A TEAM TO MAKE IT HAPPEN...

Phillips-Strickland House is staffed 24/7 by licensed, certified professionals who come together to provide the quality care you want and expect for your loved one.

- ◆ Once a person is admitted to PSH, they are greeted and welcomed into the Phillips-Strickland House family. They are given special attention by every department to make sure their needs will be met.
- ◆ Three wholesome meals are served daily and snacks are available for residents at all times. The staff works with each resident to meet special dietary needs.



- ◆ Housekeepers are happy to provide cleaning services to all residents. Laundry is also collected and returned in a timely manner.
- ◆ all worries of residents medications are managed by the staff. All medications are securely stored, dispensed timely and reordered when needed
- ◆ Residents are encouraged to attend the Resident Council meetings, held regularly, to voice their opinions and/or concerns.
- ◆ Corporators and Volunteers come together to create an atmosphere that sets Phillips-Strickland House apart from other facilities.

Today, Phillips-Strickland House is still a high-quality residential care center offering maximum independence to residents. Carefully prepared meals, assistance with activities of daily living, therapeutic and recreational activities, and the loving care of a certified and licensed staff ensure that each resident has a future filled with promise and opportunity

## ACCOMMODATIONS...

There are three types of accommodations at the Phillips-Strickland House. All have a private bedroom and bathroom

◆ Single Rooms offering one person a 12' by 12' bedroom with private bathroom and large closet. This is the room covered by Mainecare

◆ Studio Rooms are designed for one or two persons. A 12' by 18' room, private bathroom and large closet provide a comfortable setting for a couple or single person.

◆ The Two-Room Suite consists of one 12' by 12' bedroom, an 8' by 12' living room, private bathroom and double closet. Although designed

for two, one person can occupy a suite at an adjusted fee.

All rooms are furnished with draperies. Residents are encouraged to use their own furnishings. However, PSH has a limited number of items for use by persons who have no furniture of their own.

Telephone service and cable TV service are also available at the resident's expense. Convenient parking is available for residents owning cars.

## ELIGIBILITY...

To be eligible for admission a person must be:

- ◆At least 65 years of age on their last birthday.
- ◆One whose physical and mental health, as determined professionally, is consistent with the level of service offered and is compatible with the residential care environment.



## ACTIVITIES...

A wide variety of individual and group activities are offered to our residents. A complete activity program ensures that residents' interests are satisfied. Films, music, lectures, parties, exercise classes, crafts, computer access, slide show presentations and more are offered through the activities program.



## THE FACILITY...

The House is tastefully decorated, combining traditional furniture with modern construction. In addition to the living areas, there is a conveniently located library, a beautician's shop, and an activities room for use by the residents. Porches and decks provide additional enjoyment.

The Board of Directors are your friends and neighbors who volunteer their time to develop policy and guide the direction of the corporation. Our Corporators (over 150) are members of the community who volunteer their valuable time to support the residents and staff as they go about their day.

We work together to provide an environment that allows each and every resident the opportunity to reach their full potential. This team is unique to Phillips-Strickland House.

## APPLICANT SELECTION AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS...

Applicants will be required to make a full disclosure of their financial circumstances to the Administrator and/or members of the Admissions Team.

The management will arrange a private interview with all interested persons to explain the financial aspects of living at Phillips-Strickland House. This

will include a review of financial assistance through MaineCare for eligible applicants.

The PSH Corporation will not assume financial responsibility for hospital, surgical, nursing home or other major medical expenses incurred by any resident. However, the Administrator will do all that is possible to assist each and every resident in making necessary financial arrangements.
